Pink butterfly orchid Anacamptis papilionacea (L.) R.M. Bateman & al.

DESCRIPTION

This orchid reaches 15-40 cm in size. The inflorescence is composed of 5-15 large showy flowers with prominent dark stripes. The fan-shaped lip of the flower is more pale, while the hood, composed of sepals and petals, is dark red. It has 3-9 basal leaves and 2-5 smaller leaves clasping the upper stem.

HABITAT

Open grasslands and scrubland on limestone.

DISTRIBUTION

Mediterranean: southern Europe, northern Africa, extending to the Caucasus and to Iran in the east.



DANGER

Like most European orchids, its main threats are represented by habitat destruction.
