Horseshoe bee-orchid Ophrys ferrum-equinum Desf.

DESCRIPTION

Plant with 3-8 flowers formed by pink sepals and upper petals, with a blackish-brown median lip bearing a pattern in the center often reminding of a horseshoe.

HABITAT

Open woodland, scrub, phrygana and olive groves, on alkaline substrates.

DISTRIBUTION

Greece, Albania and southern Turkey.
